

Minutes of the Meeting of the International Confederation of the Society of St. Vincent De Paul (SSVP), Abuja Central Council Held on 13th July, 2019 at St. Monica Conference, Byazhin-Kubwa

1.0	<p>Attendance A total of 197 Vincentians were in attendance at the meeting. Details are as shown on pages 13, 14, 15 & 16 respectively.</p>
2.0	<p>Opening The meeting started at 10.30am with a Mass celebrated by Rev. Fr. Onyeka Okoye, the parish priest of St. Monica Conference, Byazhin.</p>
3.0	<p>Spiritual Reading The Homily delivered at the Mass by Rev. Fr. Onyeka Okoye was taken as the spiritual reflection at the meeting. In his reflection, he stated that the mass of the day is for the celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary(BVM) as the mother of God saying that the BVM is the perfect model for all who champion the cause of Charity; bringing hope to the hopeless. He thanked those who have given their gentle hearts, time, talent and treasures to the service of the poor through the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.</p> <p>He further stated that the greatest gift is the gift of ourselves which have kept our hand on the plough to ensure that hope is given to the hopeless and enjoined Vincentians not to be afraid of being misunderstood, accused or falling into a risk. To be a productive, effective and efficient vessel to carry good news to people, you need to take off fear.</p> <p>The BVM is a model; fearless – taking the proposal from an angel without fear. She lived the opposite of fear-boldness and courage, the first tabernacle to carry God and that is what we have to be as Vincentians. Fear is a limitation and with fear one cannot break new grounds and chart uncharted waters.</p> <p>Members of SSVP carry the word of God in action, expanding the Kingdom of God, making love happen and through your gentle and holy hearts, the doors of prisons are opened and prisoners are left off the hook, bringing hope to the hopeless.</p> <p>Members of the Society discomfort themselves by going to unfamiliar environments to bring good news and it will never go unrewarded. You must show courage, commitment and compromise. You must compromise many things, discomfort yourself and accept negative talks against you. What people think or do cannot break your will. Members of the Society should be kind; as the day you being wicked the glory of God will depart from you, you will be derobed and God’s favour departs from you.</p> <p>The members of the Society should evaluate their leaders; electing leaders who are kind, benevolent, compassionate. Leaders who would have positive influence on people.</p> <p>The moment Joseph’s brothers showed wickedness and sold him into slavery in Egypt, the Canaan land which is a land of promise, flowing with milk and honey became desolate and they have to go to their brother in Egypt. They were 70 that went into Egypt and 600,000 went back to Canan land. This shows that Egypt has been an incubator of the nation of Israel and so therefore, the SSVP should be an incubator of men.</p> <p>Do not feed the greedy and leave the needy, for greedy people are insatiable, lazy and criticize the Society and will always come back for more. They cannot plant a seed to germinate while the needy can plant a single seed to germinate and grow and blossom. Members of the Society should not only give food, clothes etc. but also give ideas, vision and power. Organize seminars that will empower people and change ones psyche to be able to help himself and this is also a form of charity.</p> <p>May God empower us with his word so that we will be refocused, determined and more dynamic in our work.</p>
4.0	<p>Opening Remarks by the Council President: The Council President welcomed and thanked all for turning up despite the distance. She therefore noted that due to the time spent at mass, there will be no welcome remarks of the parish priest as slated in the programme; that the priest had already welcomed us during the mass. She also stated that the welcome remarks by the host conference president will be shelved also due to time constraints. She then called for the minutes of the last meeting to be read.</p>

5.2	<p>Adoption of Minutes: In the absence of further corrections & observations, a motion for the adoption of the minutes was moved by Bro. Anigbo Victor Emeka, the Coordinator of St. Peter Claver, University of Abuja and was seconded by Sis. Linda Njoku, the conference president of St. Joseph, Zone 7 Lugbe.</p>

7.0	<p>Matters Arising from the Minutes.</p>
7.1	<p>Update on Ozanam House Project: Sis. Agatha Irabor, on behalf of the committee chairman, reported that the technical committee handling the issue of getting a working drawing for the project got in touch with a Vincentian, Arch. Emmanuel from Holy Family Conference who accepted to produce a design for the Ozanam House. However, he backed out of the project as a result of pressure and time constraints to deliver within a specified timeline.</p> <p>Based on this development, she, also an Architect, decided to take up the challenge of producing a preliminary design and she promised to deliver within 2 weeks.</p> <p>In a similar development, they were also in touch with Engr. Patrick, a Civil Engineer, whom they took to the site to assess what is to be done. After visiting the site, the Engineer advised that erecting a culvert will serve the purpose instead of a bridge.</p> <p>Sis. Jumai Kwanashie was detailed to follow up on the engineer to produce the design and also the cost of the culvert.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the president thanked the Committee for their efforts but noted that it is disheartening that we have engineers and architects existing in our various conferences, yet we are not able to engage any despite all the announcement done in that regard. She also noted that we need to use what we have to achieve our purpose and stated that the Council will not relent and will still make announcements seeking for Engineers to join the committee. She appealed to conference presidents to send in the names of Engineers and Architects in their conferences so that the Council will contact them.</p>
7.2	<p>Report on the election of the president of St. Jude Zuba: Bro. Albert Nzekwu reported that the election was conducted on the 12th May, 2019. After the election, Sis. Priscilla Oya emerged as the president and she has since constituted her board.</p>
7.3	<p>Report on St. James Dawaki: Bro. Albert Nzekwu reported that they visited the Centre on the 23rd June 2019 for awareness campaign and sensitization and was able to get only 5 members. However, no member of the Centre was present at the Council meeting.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the president noted that the sensitization without follow up is counterproductive. She then mandated them to follow up and possibly sensitive them again.</p>
7.4	<p>Update on the Inauguration of Our lady of Fatima, Kalmajiji:</p> <p>Bro. Fidelis Molokwu reported by recalling that at the last meeting the Central Council the decision for inauguration of the Centre was put on hold until this meeting. He further reported that the Centre has picked 8th September, 2019 for inauguration subject to approval by the Council. The center presently has 18 members.</p> <p>The Coordinator of the Centre, Bro. Aladi Jude, stated that they have initiated a monthly meeting together with St. Michael Centre, and have been doing that regularly.</p> <p>On St. Michael Centre Piwoyi, Bro. Fidelis also reported that two (2) members have joined the Centre, however</p>

	<p>they still have the problem of a leadership that is not committed. And that the parish priest has instructed that the leadership be changed for a more committed person. A decision on this will be taken at the next meeting.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president, after due consultations with the board announced that the request for inauguration has been granted. Consequently, Our Lady of Fatima Karonmajiji will be inaugurated at the stated date at 9.00am mass.</p>
7.5	<p>Report on St. Andrew Centre, Orozo:</p> <p>Bro. Bonaventure Nwokpor reported that the zone carried out awareness campaign and membership drive at the Center after which twenty-one (21) members indicated interest to join. They educated the new members on the rules of the Society and instructed CKC conference, Kurudu and St. Patrick Conference, Karshi to monitor the Centre. They have Sis. Maduekwe Chinenye as the coordinator and Bro. Amobi as the secretary and they have been recording an average of 13 members in attendance at their meetings.</p> <p>They meet every Saturday after morning mass and the monitors have always been with them at their meetings. The zone extracted some relevant pages from the manual for their use at their meetings since the manual of the Society is not available.</p>
7.6	<p>Zonal Reports.</p>
7.61	<p>Karu Zone:</p> <p>Bro. Chuks Nwokpor, the Coordinator of the zone, reported that the zone met on 9th May, 2019 at St. Andrew Orozo where they discussed on how to strengthen St. Andrew Centre as they are having membership issues. Subsequently, an awareness campaign was carried out in the centre at 6.30am and 8.30am masses where 21 persons indicated interest in joining the society. However, on a Saturday of that week, after the awareness campaign, 18 of them turned out for briefing on the Society rules as agreed. Some of them were given some responsibilities. They have been monitoring and mentoring them and about 10 - 15 of them are still attending the conference meetings. Other activities of the Zone include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. St. Joseph Centre, Gidanmangoro He equally reported that they also visited St. Joseph Center Gidanmangoro where they discovered that Parish compound is very small and the Centre does not have a container or store and have to keep their items at the catechist's house. They were instructed to liaise with the Parish Priest to give them a space where they can erect a batcher to serve as store temporarily. b. St. Ignatius of Antioch: Even though their financial strength is not yet okay, they are seen to be doing well. They have about 20 members, organized and very active and he then urged the Central Council to reconsider their application for inauguration. <p>Responding to the reports, the Council president stated that there is need for the zone to be meeting monthly and instructed that in respect of St. Joseph Centre, Gidanmangoro, the zone should send a delegation to the Parish priest to help secure a place to erect a batcher or place a container for their items.</p>
7.62	<p>Kubwa Zone:</p> <p>The Conference President of CKC Kubwa reported that the zone met twice on the 28th April and 22nd May, 2019 at CKC Kubwa.</p> <p>They carried out awareness campaign at St. James Dawake at 6.30am and 9.30am mass respectively. Sadly, they were able to get only 5 persons to join the society which was attributed to the suspected belief by parishioners that members of the society should be poor people. Efforts made to get the priest to add his voice to the membership drive during the mass failed.</p> <p>He also reported that the coordinator has issues in handling the activities of the Conference which deters people from joining the Society. The Centre has now about 10 members. They also visited some Conferences within the zone observed their meetings and corrected some anomalies.</p> <p>They also had training for all conferences within the zone at CKC Kubwa where the ITVP-1 and the Central Council president were the resource persons. Other activities of the zone include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Elections at St. Jude Conference, Zuba: He reported that the Conference has a peculiar situation whereby most member are the youth and adults shying away from responsibilities. After the election, Sis. Priscilla Oyah emerged the president of the conference and she has constituted her board as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Titus Nwele – Vice President ii. Nenneth Odoh – Secretary iii. Aladi Peter – Assistant Secretary

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> iv. Sylvanus Emechebe – Treasurer v. Martin Godwin – Youth Coordinator vi. Comfort Ndukwe – Financial Secretary <p>He stated also that more sensitization is needed at the conference. They have been following up on the conference to ensure that their activities are in line with the norms of the Society and bank account opening has been taken as priority.</p> <p>The zone also organized training for its members in which the ITVP Africa 1 and the Council President were present.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> b. St. Matthew Ushafa: the members of the Centre participated actively in the activities of the Zone. They are presently being groomed to understand the rules of the Society before election of a coordinator. He has no report to give on St. Michael Sabon Gari. c. St. Donatus Dutse: The church is not yet a full parish and has only 4 members. <p>On a sad note however, he reported also that within the period, they recorded some deaths within their zone which includes the death of the Patron of CKC Conference, Bro. Paul Nwachukwu, and the death of the mother of the president of St. Luke’s Conference Kubwa.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president instructed them to carry out awareness campaign at St. Matthew Ushaffa.</p>
7.63	<p>Life Camp Zone:</p> <p>Bro. Chika Mmuobike, the Zonal Coordinator, reported that they had meeting on 25th May and 22nd June, 2019 respectively. The issues discussed at the meeting and other activities of the Zone include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Taking of Pregnant women to the Hospital: The meeting concluded that any conference taking a pregnant woman to the hospital should ensure that a close relative accompanies them. This is to avert the issue of not having someone to endorse in case of emergency surgical procedure. 2. Each conference must come to their zonal meetings with all their board members or at least 3 members. 3. Inaugurated conferences should take care and nurture Centres within their jurisdiction 4. They will be carrying out awareness campaign at St. Matthew Gwagwa 5. The parish priest of St. Augustine’s Centre Mabushi requested for awareness campaign. However, the dates are still being awaited. 6. All inaugurated Conferences within the zone were mandated to bring their account record booklet in the next meeting for scrutiny and analysis. 7. They also discovered that St. Phillip Centre Old Karimo is having problems. The members will mount their boxes on Sundays and disappear. They don’t have regular meetings. 8. St. Joseph Centre Gwagwa and St. Peter Gwagwa exist close to each other. While the former has no SSVP in existence the later has. <p>The next meeting will be coming up on the Saturday 20th July, 2019 after the Central Council meeting at St. Fabian Centre Efab.</p>
7.64	<p>Garki Zone:</p> <p>The Zonal Coordinator, Bro. John Okoro reported that the zone had their meeting at Holy Trinity, Maitama and have been moving around visiting conferences and Centers. It was discovered that most conferences does not carry out visitations rather they attend to masters at meetings.</p> <p>Consequently, they grouped all conferences and centers for visitations and mapped out the modalities for visitation to various hospitals within the zone. They contributed money for the visitation and decided on the frequency of visit.</p> <p>Presently, the St. Charles Lwanga, Apo group has reported that they have officially secured a date for visitation to a hospital and will soon embark on the visit.</p> <p>Presently only 12 Apostles visit National Hospital because of some unresolved issues. They also visited Kpegi village</p>

and Suleija prison while Church of Assumption visited Kuruduma village.

Holy Trinity Maitama also had an election where Bro. Gerald Uko emerged the new president.

LUX Terra Chapel:

It was discovered that the SSVP there had not been meeting since the time their existence was reported at the Council.

Responding to the report, the president requested that the presidents of 12 Apostles and St. Lwanga Apo wait behind for a brief meeting after the Central Council meeting.

She also instructed that they book appointment with the Parish Priest of Lux Terra Chapel to see how to revitalize the SSVP group.

7.65 Lugbe Zone:

Bro. Fidelis Molokwu, the Zonal Coordinator, reported that within their zone they have identified 8 conferences and 21 Centers out of which 19 are doing well while the rest have issues. However, there has been an improvement in their performance since the last report and they are working on the malfunctioning conferences and centers. Within this period, they have met twice and communicate mostly via WhatsApp platform and had joint visitation to two (2) orphanage homes.

The Sacred Heart Conference, Gwagwalada was assigned to visit conferences around Giri, University and Sheda but they prefer to carry out the visit together with St. Paul's Conference, Gwagwalada.

They also visited St. Catherine Center, Giri and St. Mary's Center, Sheda and met only one (1) member at the later. They also discovered that St. Mary's Centre is not vibrant hence the decision to carry out awareness campaign. Some other activities of the zone include:

a. St. Augustine, Lugbe:

He reported that he is not getting the cooperation from members; the coordinator seems to be very busy. They booked for awareness campaign but the catechists did not call for that during the mass and he claimed later that he was not informed. The coordinator was asked to make another arrangement for awareness campaign.

b. Burial of the President of Sacred Heart Conference, Airport:

The Zonal Coordinator also reported that they represented the Council at the burial of Late Bro. Anayo Egbo as directed by the Council. About 11 Vincentians from different Centers and conferences including members of Sacred Heart Conference attended the requiem mass and the wake keep. Thereafter, they visited the widow, encouraged and prayed with her and also presented a token to her. Other members also supported and she was very grateful. Two members travelled with them for the burial.

c. St. Peter Claver Center University of Abuja:

He reported that most of the members of the Centre are in their final year and will be graduating very soon. However, the Coordinator of the Centre reported that in their recent drive for members, 20 students at the lower levels declared interest and as such their membership has been boosted by 20 new members.

d. St. Mary's Center, Tudun Wada:

The Center has no membership problem; however, their weekly collections are still poor and not encouraging. It is believed that they Church building project is stifling the finances of the Centre. Finally, he reported that St. Martins and Guardian Angel Conferences are also assisting the Centers around them.

e. St. Anthony Center, Paseli:

The coordinator has not been cooperating. The Conference president of St. Kizito, Kuje was asked to visit them but he observed that St. Kizito president is always having issues with the coordinator.

f. St. Peters Abaji:

There has been some improvement in their operations however they are yet to open account. This made some conferences reluctant to assist them financially when they appealed for assistance for their master in the hospital.

In her response, the coordinator of the Centre appreciated those that assisted them when they appealed for financial assistance and noted that the master is responding to treatment. She however informed the Council that their mother conference, Sacred Heart, is not helping them. She equally stated that the account will be opened in a week's time.

	<p>In his reaction to the allegation, the President of Sacred Heart Conference stated that they have surge of masters who depreciates their income always that they don't have much left to assist the conference they are nurturing.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president thanked the zonal coordinator for the efforts made by the zone and requested that they meet with the parish priest of St. Mary's Tudun Wada with the view to convincing him of the need to provide opportunity for the Society to address the parishioners.</p> <p>On St. Anthony Paseli, she advised him to take the next zonal meeting to the Centre and requested that the Coordinator of the Center and Conference President of St. Kizito wait behind for a brief meeting.</p> <p>On St. Augustine, she advised the coordinator not to go for awareness campaign alone and that he should coopt more members. And now that our spiritual adviser is their parish priest, the job will be easier.</p> <p>On St. Michael Piwoyi, she mandated them to give progress report at the next Council meeting.</p> <p>She will also meet with the conference president of St. Kizito Kuje after the Council meeting to discuss on St. Anthony, Paseli and St. Francis, Kpegyi.</p>
7.7	<p>Report on Prison Visitations for May and June, 2019:</p> <p>a. May Visitation: The conference president of OLQN, Garki who coordinated the visit reported that the group is made up of 7 conferences and centers but the visitation was difficult to coordinate as most conferences did not respond to telephone calls and messages sent to them. St. Dominic Kwali, he reported, from his observations, seems not to exist and may need to be revived. Nevertheless, they were able to gather some items used for the visitation.</p> <p>b. June Visitation: The newly elected conference president of Holy Trinity, Maitama, Bro. Gerald Uko reported that they have six (6) Conferences and Centres in their group out of which 3 responded to the visitation. Efforts he made to reach Our Lady Queen of Hearts, Galadimawa proved abortive. The Coordinator of St. Phillip Old Karimo, when contacted stated that he does not know much about the Society and referred him to the Secretary who could not be reached. St. Raphael Garki who promised a bag of Garri later delivered it to OLQN office. The Holy Trinity Maitama and St. Kevin Jikwoyi arranged and delivered the contributions to Rev.Fr. Victor Nyoroh, CM at St. Kizito, Kuje. The Coordinator of St. Anthony Jabi, in his reaction stated that they were requested to contribute a bag of rice but were not at that point capable of the requested contribution.</p> <p>In her response to the report, the Council president stated that we all agreed for the prison visitation and as such we have to take it seriously. Groups should try and plan ahead of time and donate whatever you can afford that is reasonable. The next visit in July, 2019 will be coordinated by Holy Family Conference, Life Camp.</p>
7.8	<p>Opening of Bank Account by Conferences: The Council President harped once more on the importance of conferences having a bank account for their daily transactions and also decried the flouting of the directive of the Council on the account opening stating that despite repeated calls for such are yet to do so.</p> <p>Various conferences and centers yet to open account gave reasons for their inability to comply with the directive of the Council. Some of them include:</p> <p>a. St. Augustine Dutse: Bro. Igbele Anula reported that they have some issues; the parish priest has signed their application form however, there was a mistake by the second signatory to the account. The application will be submitted as soon as the mistake is corrected.</p> <p>b. St. Joseph Zone 7, Lugbe: The president of the conference stated that they had to wait until the new president is elected to commence the process of account opening. Subsequently, after the election, their parish priest was transferred however; the new parish priest stated that the Archbishop has to be a signatory to the account as a new directive in the Archdiocese and gave same condition to other societies in the church that already have bank accounts.</p>

However, the priest has scheduled a meeting with the Societies to iron out the issue after observing the information did not go down well with the parishioners.

c. St. Monica Byzahin:

Bro. Gerald Ajoku reported that a new priest had just been posted to their parish after the demise of the former priest. He assured the Council that within three (3) weeks they will wrap up the account opening.

d. St. Mathew Ushaffa: Reported that they were in the process of the account opening but was halted by the parish priest who said he will introduce them to a bank that he wants them to partner with.

The Council president while responding to the report mandated them to inform their parish priest that the Council has given them 2 weeks to conclude the account opening.

e. Our Lady of Fatima, Karonmajiji: Reported that their parish priest is delaying the account opening telling them to take it easy.

The council president in her response mandated the Zonal Coordinator to accompany them to meet with their priest and discuss the issue.

f. Sacred Heart, Airport: They have completed the application form and submitted same to First Bank. Presently, the bank informed them that they are conducting verification and called them a week ago to represent the ID of one of the signatories.

In her general response to the excuses given by the Conferences and Centers the Council president mandated Conferences not to render financial assistance to any conference or center that requested for such but does not have a bank account.

7.9 National Youth Rally – An Update:

The youth coordinator recalled that the national youth rally was slated to hold from August 29 to September 1, 2019 and Abuja Metro Council will be hosting.

He then informed members that the Bishop of Lafia Diocese has graciously approved Our Lady of Apostles, Akwanga to be used as venue for the rally.

He further informed the Council that each Metro Council is expected to be in attendance with 30 delegates at a registration cost of 3,000 each and members from Abuja Metro Council will have an open admission. A block levy of N15, 000 each will be contributed by each Metro Council.

Abuja Central Council has been mandated to arrange and provide for publicity as part of their contributions to the rally. He therefore urged the Conference Presidents to sponsor a youth from their conferences.

He finally announced that the next Council youth meeting comes up on 28th July, 2019 at St. Pius X Conference, Gbagalape.

7.10 Youth Training:

The youth Coordinator reported that the training which had in attendance about 72 participants was a huge

success despite the fact that members turned up late to the training. Also, the parish priest and his associate welcomed the youth and thanked them for choosing their parish and also urged them to continue the good work of charity and be the true light of the society.
