

Minutes of the Meeting of the International Confederation of the Society of St. Vincent De Paul (SSVP) Abuja Central Council Held on 26th January, 2019 at St. Rita's Conference, Dakwo, Abuja.

1.0	<p>Attendance A total of 196 Vincentians were in attendance at the meeting. Details are as shown on pages 12, 13, 14 & 15 respectively.</p>
2.0	<p>Opening The meeting started at 10.45am with a mass celebrated by Rev. Fr. Samson Adachaba, the Parish Priest of the host parish, St. Rita Dakwo.</p>
3.0	<p>Spiritual Reading The homily for the mass was taken as the spiritual reading for the meeting. In his homily, Fr. Samson Adachaba remarked that SSVP is a difficult Society to belong to and wondered how members cope in dealing with the day to day challenges thrown up by the ever growing number of the poor who may have applied harassment, emotional blackmail etc. in getting what they want or even deceived members with sweet stories.</p> <p>He further said that yet in the midst of these challenges, members carry out their tasks with good intentions not dipping your hands in what belongs to the poor. "You sacrifice your energy, money and time for the service of the poor and some of you find joy and feel good when you touch lives".</p> <p>He also advised members not to dip their hands into that which belongs to the poor saying that those who do such are leprous hands that should not be members of the Society and should be encouraged to join another society. Such persons are capable of tarnishing the image of the Society and members should expose such persons otherwise they partake in the wrath.</p> <p>He encouraged members to carry on with the difficult task faced as members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul which is regarded as the Charity face of the Catholic Church. He prayed God to bless each one as they carry on with this task and continue to encourage one another.</p>
4.0	<p>Opening Remarks by the Council President: The Council President welcomed all to the first meeting of the year by saying "HAPPY NEW YEAR" to all. She also remarked that it is not easy to be a Vincentian saying that it is a voluntary work taken upon by members and as such one should not aspire to finish this work and go to hell. "With prayer and steadfastness we can overcome our challenges. God will see us through our work and help us to overcome".</p> <p>She further remarked that the annual report will be submitted and this is part of the service we render to our lords and masters. She finally welcomed all and prayed God for fruitful deliberations.</p>
5.0	<p>Welcome Remarks by the Parish Priest of Sacred Heart Parish, Airport: The homily given by the Parish Priest was taken as the welcome remarks.</p>
6.0	<p>Welcome Remark by the President of the Host Conference. The Conference President, Bro. Marcel Ekeneme, on behalf of the members welcomed the Council to the conference. He said that since their inauguration they have not witnessed this great congregation of Vincentians. He informed the Council that they are facing a lot of challenges because poverty abounds in the society but they have managed to remain afloat through the support of the parish priest and parishioners and other conferences that came to their assistance in times of need. He finally prayed for fruitful deliberations and successful meeting for the Council.</p>

<p>9.0</p>	<p>Matters Arising from the Minutes.</p>
<p>9.1</p>	<p>Submission of Annual Report: The Council President called on conferences to proceed to submit their annual reports to the Secretary of the Council. However, she announced that conferences that did not come with their reports to indicate. Several conferences indicated and gave their reasons for non-submission as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. St. Mathew Conference, Ushafa: Bro. Emmanuel Itodo informed the Council that their Treasurer has been out of town and they could not get the details of the record. 2. St. Benedict’s Conference, Lokogoma: Bro. Linus Njoku reported that their secretary travelled with the hope of coming back earlier to prepare the report but couldn’t make it. He promised that unflinchingly, they will submit their report the following Monday. 3. St. Jude Conference, Zuba: Bro. Martins Godwin reported that their acting president is having issues at his work place and could not come to submit a report that that has been completed. 4. Holy Ghost Conference, Saburi: Bro. Benedict Anyadike reported that they are still working on the report, stating that they are faced with the challenge that throughout 2018, nothing was recorded on the annual report booklet. The new president met this situation but is working hard to produce a report and will be ready soon. 5. St. Francis Centre, Bagusa Dei-Dei: Sir. Stephen Y. Iyodo informed the Council that the Center is still at the formative stage and it’s their first time of attending Council meeting. Their spiritual director is guiding them and Holy Ghost Saburi is supervising them. 6. Holy Trinity Conference, Maitama: They could not submit their report because the reports of centers under them came to them late and they have to ensure that reports are correct before submission. To submit them soon. <p>In her response to the excuses giving by the conferences, the Council president noted that Annual Report writing should no longer be a difficult task for Conferences because the Council has made it easier by providing a report booklet for weekly record of accounts.</p> <p>She then gave the conferences up till February 1, 2019 to submit their reports with late submission</p>

	penalty of N5,000.00. Failure to submit the report after this deadline will lead to the Conference president stepping down.
9.2	<p>Update on Ozanam House Project:</p> <p>Sis. Agatha Irabor apologized to the Council on behalf of the Committee for their inability to meet and take a concrete action on the task given to them till date. She informed the Council that this inability was due to the fact that the Chairman travelled abroad on health grounds and efforts made to secure the land documents before he left proved abortive.</p> <p>However, the documents have been forwarded to them and they are poised to meet and take the necessary action.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president noted that the Ozanam House Project is dear to the Council and the Council has made its yearly contribution of N1, 000,000.00 to the project account. She then enjoined the committee to work hard.</p>
9.3	<p>Report of Central Council Training at St. Benedict Conference, Lokogoma:</p> <p>Bro. James Ishom, the Council Training Officer, reported that the Society of St. Vincent De Paul, Abuja Central Council in line with her training programme to equip Vincentians with the right leadership skills and capacity development as a veritable tool for sustainable development organized a special training on the following topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. "Basic Understanding of the Vincentian Apostolate", delivered by the Abuja Central Council President, Sis. Joy Ohiagu. 2. "Explanations on the New Introductions to the Comprehensive Annual Reporting and Packaging" prepared by Bro. Chibuzor Ezeani, the immediate past Council President. <p>The second topic was delivered by Bro. Ugo Anaedobe, the Central Council Secretary, on behalf of Bro. Chibuzor Ezeani, who was unavoidably absent.</p> <p>He also reported that the training which had in attendance a total of 255 Vincentians from the various conferences in the Council took place on the 13th October, 2018 at St. Benedict Conference, Lokogoma and was targeted at improving the leadership qualities of conference presidents and members as well as awakening the spirit of Vincentian apostolate which is the hallmark of our vocation.</p> <p>The need for accountability and record keeping was also emphasized as very important in the activities of the society hence the introduction of new items in the accounting package of the society.</p> <p>Furthermore, the training also outlined the essential qualities of good annual report writing and exposed members to detailed financial and statistical report. In this segment members were taught how to prepare an acceptable financial annual report in an approved central council annual report template. While preparing the report we are expected to state both financial and non-financial activities of the society.</p> <p>In each of the lecture there was room for questions and answers session during which, the Council President, in one of her responses, frowned at the failure of some conferences in annual financial report preparation despite series of training on report writing by the Central Council. She also urged all the conference presidents to take it very seriously.</p> <p>He equally noted that he hoped there will be an improvement in the annual reporting as the conferences submit their reports. Enjoined all to always avail themselves of the Council training.</p> <p>He finally appreciated the Council Board members and those who participated in the training saying that "to us it was a show of commitment and passion for the society". He then prayed God to bless each and every one.</p>
9.4	<p>Report on the determination of jurisdiction of Archangel Chapel Centre, Nyanya:</p> <p>Bro. Bonaventure Nwokpor reported that the jurisdictional scope has been determined between SS Peter & Paul Conference, Nyanya and Archangel Police Chaplaincy, Nyanya. He also reported that the</p>

	<p>Conference and Centre are satisfied with what was done and working harmoniously to respect the jurisdiction.</p>
9.5	<p>Report on the alleged infraction by the president of St. Jude Zuba: Bro Henry Enwerem reported that the monitoring team visited St. Jude, Zuba, dissolved the board and appointed an interim president. They have also put through a call to the past president but did not get a response.</p> <p>Reporting also, Bro. Innocent Ani, the patron of the conference, informed the Council that the past president has left the parish and that all conference documents have been recovered except the ones in the custody past president which he promised to return. They also agreed at the parish that election will be conducted after 6months which will coincide with the expiration of tenure of the past president.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president thanked the group for their efforts and enjoined them to follow up the conference to ensure stability. She however insisted and directed that election be conducted in 2 months.</p>
9.6	<p>Report on St. Rita Dakwo and Holy Cross Conference, Apo: The coordinator of the Garki Zonal monitoring team, Bro. John Okoro, reported that they visited St. Rita Dakwo, but was not welcomed. He stated that the Conference insisted that they have no right to visit them without the Central Council officially notifying them..</p> <p>He further reported that he always sends sms to them informing them of every meeting of the zone but they rebuffed every attempt to meet with them.</p> <p>In his defense, the conference president of St. Rita, Dakwo, Bro, Marcel Ekeneme, faulted the monitoring group for not taking out time to find out the reasons why they are not attending meetings instead choose to report them to the Council.</p> <p>On Holy Cross Conference Apo, Bro. Okoro also reported that they had made progress in resolving the issues at the conference. The former coordinator had paid the N10,000 promised leaving a balance of 40,000 and is to pay additional 10,000 in the upper week.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president reminded Vincentians that we are all one and working together to uplift the Society and not to run down any person. We cannot afford to work at cross purposes.</p> <p>She equally said that the president as well as the monitoring team or any other persons delegated by the president can visit the conference without notice. The monitoring team is for all of us and works for the good of the Society and all conference presidents are part of the team. She then mandated St. Rita Dakwo to forward two (2) names who will be members of the monitoring team.</p>
9.7	<p>Report on St. Matthew Ushafa: Bro. Albert Nzekwu, the conference president of CKC Kubwa, reported that they visited the Centre and discovered that the shortcomings and problems existing are primarily because the treasurer was not around and the other members of the executives are not forthcoming.</p> <p>They also have new members who joined but most of them quickly left when informed of the rule of the Society which prevents members from benefiting from the purse of the poor.</p> <p>They equally met with the Parish Priest who informed them that his relationship with the Conference has been very cordial but advised that the Council come for awareness campaign.</p> <p>In this regard, Sunday, 3rd of February was proposed for the awareness campaign at 8.00am mass. He encouraged members of the Society from the zone to join them for the campaign and in their uniforms.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president mandated the Kubwa Monitoring Zone to lead the awareness campaign and to be joined by members from the zone.</p>
9.8	<p>Update on FAMVIN 2019 AGM: Bro. Chika Mmuobike reported that the Annual General Meeting (AGM) has been shifted to 20th - 23rd March, 2019 because of the oncoming election and will take place at the Daughters of Divine Love Retreat and Conference Centre (DRAAC) Sabon Lugbe. The theme of the AGM has been chosen as “Systemic Approach Towards Our Service to the Poor in Nigeria Today”.</p>

	<p>He also reported that the National Council has mapped out the delegates quota for the various arms as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • International Confederation of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Nigeria: 30 • Daughters of Charity: 10 • Association of the Miraculous Medal: 5 • Ladies of Charity: 10 • Congregation of the Missions: 10 • Vincentian Marian Youth: 5 <p>The sum of 15,000.00 will be paid by each delegate.</p> <p>Adding her voice to the report, the Council President informed the Council that the Vincentian Family (FAMVIN) has been working on the Systemic Change for a while and they will be bringing people from outside Nigeria to talk to us.</p> <p>There is also going to be the launching of Almanac and the Abuja Central Council of SSVP is to bring a minimum of 10 launchers. The proceeds from the launching will be used to build a skill acquisition centre.</p> <p>Consequently, Grade A conferences were mandated to provide the Council with one (1) person each for the launch. The name of the person and phone number is needed to enable the Council reach out to them.</p> <p>The conference members are expected to participate in the AGM specifically on Saturday, 23rd March, 2019 wherein lectures will be given before the launch.</p> <p>Consequently, conferences were mandated to send a minimum of 1 member each to the AGM and will pay a registration fee of N2, 000.00 each to cover lunch and conference materials.</p> <p>She final instructed Conferences to submit the names of their representatives to Bro. Abraham Zoko at OLQN Garki and register on or before 15th March, 2019.</p>
<p>9.9</p>	<p>Report on St. James Dawaki:</p> <p>Bro. Albert Nzekwu reported that a team has been mandated by the monitoring team to visit the Centre but they are yet to do so. He promised that the team will unfailingly visit the Centre and a report will be submitted before the next Council meeting.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president admonished the Kubwa zonal group to wake up to their responsibilities saying also that it is important that they sit up.</p>
<p>9.10</p>	<p>Inauguration of Our Lady of Fatima Kalmajiji:</p> <p>The coordinator of the Centre informed the Council that their parish priest is insisting that the parent parish (St. Michael, Piwoyi) has to be inaugurated before the outstation (Our Lady of Fatima, Kalmajiji). He further reported that St. Michael, Pwoyi has only 4 members.</p> <p>In her response, the Council President mandated the Zonal monitoring team to meet with the Parish Priest and sort out the issue. Consequently, the planned inauguration was kept-in-view.</p>
<p>9.11</p>	<p>Report on St. Andrew Centre, Orozo:</p> <p>There was no report on the Centre which is expected from the Conferences of CKC, Kurudu and St. Patrick, Karshi. It should be recalled that at the last Central Council meeting, the Council President mandated CKC Kurudu and St. Patrick Karshi to take care of the Centre, meet with the parish priest for a possible awareness campaign and if they are finding things difficult, to consult with the Zonal Coordinator.</p> <p>In her response, the Council President frowned at the inability of the two conferences to carry out the assignment as directed and also mandated that St. Andrew Orozo should be present at the next Council meeting and there should be a report for the Council.</p>
<p>9.12</p>	<p>Reports of the Election of the Conference Presidents of St. Monica, Byazhin, CKC Kubwa and St. Benedict, Kurudu.</p> <p>St. Monica, Byazhin: It was reported that the election took place as scheduled with the emergence of Bro. Gerald Jerry Ajoku as president. He has since appointed his board namely:</p>

Ifeoma Orji – Youth Coordinator <p>St. Benedict Conference, Lokogoma: Bro. Obi Anaduaka reported that the election held on December 1, 2018 but he was represented by his conference secretary. At the end of the election Sis. Ebere Ameh emerged as president of the conference. She has since constituted her board as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Sis. 9.13	ZONAL REPORTS
9.13.1	<p>Gwagwalada Zone: Bro. Fidelis Molokwu, the coordinator of the zone reported on their actions on two conferences viz.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. St. Mary’s Centre, Tudun Wada: He went with the coordinator to meet with the Parish Priest to sort out issues. ii. St. Augustine, Lugbe: They visited the conference where it was discovered that they have 3 members but they are not meeting. The coordinator promised to be at the Central Council meeting but sent a message earlier before the Council meeting that he will no longer be present as promised. <p>He equally reported that the zonal monitoring team has not actually met as a group for a meeting but they have been communicating over the phone. He then used the opportunity to announce that conferences within the zone should wait behind after the meeting for a brief meeting wherein they will choose a date for their general meeting and possibly co-opt more members.</p> <p>Responding to the report, the Council president noted that Gwagwalada Zone is very large and needs more hands to cover the zone. She equally stressed the important of this monitoring saying that it is an opportunity to strengthen conferences that are weak.</p>
9.13.2	<p>Life Camp Zone: The coordinator of the zone, Bro Chika Mmuobike reported that the zone met on November 17, 2018. All the Conferences and Centres were present except one. The zone went on visitation to the school of the blind and had a successful visit. He also reported that during the Christmas Sharing, they zone coordinated and assisted the parishes</p>

	<p>that doesn't have enough by directing the grade A parishes to assist. Their next meeting comes up on the 3rd Sunday of February at Our Lady of Perpetual Help conference.</p>
9.13.3	<p>Kubwa Zone: Bro Albert Nzekwu reported that the zone was able to send out delegates to visit some conferences but unfortunately a report of the visit is yet to be available, hence he could not report on those visits. He however reported that they visited Seat of Wisdom and St. Matthew Ushafa but the former was not in session. The zone meets every 3rd Sunday of the month at CKC conference Kubwa..</p>
10.0	<p>Other Matters:</p>
10.1	<p>Prison Visitation: The Council president informed members that during the Christmas period the Council accompanied the Cardinal in his annual visit to the prisons. During the visit, the Prison Chaplain, Fr. Victor Nyoroh complained about the poor feeding of the prisoners. In response to that, the Council in her board meeting has decided to form 12 groups comprising of conferences within the Council to be visiting prisons every month of the year. The Kuje, Gwagwalada and Suleija Prisons are expected to be covered within the year. To this effect, the Council will bring out a schedule for the feeding and will post it on the platform. She noted that prison apostolate is part of the Vincentian work and the Council is looking at starting up in March, 2019. For every visit, the group is to agree on what to give and handover to the Chaplain who will decide which of the prisons to deliver the materials. The chaplain has assured that he will ensure that whatever was delivered will get to the prisoners. However, if it is discovered after some time that the food is not getting to the prisoners, the Council may decide to discontinue.</p>
10.2	<p>Conference Grading: The Council president informed the Council that there has been a slight adjustment on the grades of some conferences. She announced that St. Mary's, Karu, that has been in Grade B is now elevated to Grade A while Our Lady Queen of Peace, Utako, Church of Annunciation, Gbazango, Arab Road, Kubwa and Church of the Archangels, Durunmi, all in Group C have been elevated to Grade B. The Council president congratulated the elevated conferences and said that their elevation is in recognition of their performance and also noted that reward for good work is more work and the capacity to do the work is the watch word.</p>
10.3	<p>Compliance with the Council's Year Planner: The Council president informed the Council that it has been observed that some conferences fix activities on the date earmarked for a general Council activity as stated in the Council's program for the year. She stated that the essence of the Councils Year Planner which is given to conferences very early at the beginning of each year is to enable them to draw their programmes so as not to clash with the Council's program. She specifically mentioned violators as Holy Rosary, Wuse and St. John Paul II, Kubwa and said that while the former did their Christmas Sharing on a different date, the later went on a rural visitation instead of sharing. This, she said put pressure on the conferences within the area on the day of Christmas Sharing. Responding, the Holy Rosary conference explained that the Parish priest needed to use the venue normally used for the Sharing on that same day and that displaced them. They however apologized for the inconveniences caused other conferences within the area. Also, the Pope John Paul II, Kubwa explained that they have the moral obligation to go to the immediate community which is not close to their parish for food sharing and not visitation as reported.</p>

	<p>The Council president reiterated that the Christmas and Easter Sharing are mandatory and the dates are sacrosanct and sharing activity must be done simultaneously. She enjoined conferences to comply with instructions so as not to cause problems for other sister conferences.</p>
10.4	<p>Levies:</p> <p>The Council President recalled that the budget of the Council had been prepared and communicated to all conferences at the last Council meeting. Additionally, the levies for the various grades of conferences had also been published as follows: Grade A – 135,000; Grade B – 80,000.00; Grade C – 45,000.00 and Grade D – 10,000. This was also communicated to all conferences.</p> <p>She further said that it has been observed that many conferences owe large sums of money to the Central Council and effort is not being made to offset these debts.</p> <p>She reiterated the fact that the Council functions with the levies paid by conferences and enjoined the conferences indebted to the Council to pay up even in bits.</p> <p>She therefore urged conferences that have not paid up till the month of April to pay up their debts.</p> <p>In the light of the above, Bro. Paul Ocheme from Guardian Angel Police Chaplaincy noted that most members of their conference react whenever the issue of levies are mentioned wondering what the Council does with the levies since it does not take care of the masters.</p> <p>In her response, the Council president said that it is the duty of a conference president who participates actively in Council activities to explain to members of his conference what the levies are meant for. The conference members have the right to know how these funds are expended.</p> <p>However, it is instructive to note that the Council has a yearly budget which is always circulated to members and guides the Council in her expenditure. There are other activities which are not included which includes training and feast day support to host conferences. Also, the Council earmarks the sum of N1m each year for Ozanam house project.</p> <p>Furthermore, she equally explained that the Council prepares two accounts annually viz: the annual report, which is the aggregation of the reports of conferences and the Central Council account which comprise of the income and expenditure within the year under review. These accounts are made known to members of the Council and it is also forwarded to the conferences e-mail accounts. The Council also forwards these accounts to the Cardinal as well as the Spiritual adviser of the Council.</p>
10.5	<p>Conference Bank Accounts:</p> <p>The Council President noted that it has been observed that some conferences operates without a bank account and wonders how they keep their money and how they will expect to get funds from donors. She also said that those who want to donate to charity may decide to transfer fund.</p> <p>Querying the Conferences on the bank accounts, so many conferences indicated not having accounts, inaugurated and un-inaugurated conferences alike.</p> <p>She however said that Centers can be pardoned for this infraction but Conferences are unpardonable. Nigeria now has more than 1000 aggregated conferences which will grant it a permanent seat in International Council v. Uniforms, Manuals and Directories: The National Council will be producing the next batch of Uniforms, Manuals and Directory and as such has created a unified account where all monies for these items will be credited. vi. Recruitment Guide: The National Council has introduced a booklet which serves as a guide for recruitment of new members to the Society.
