A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AT THE END OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE VINCENTIAN FAMILY (FAMVIN) HELD AT ST. LOUISE PROVINCIAL HOUSE OF THE DAUGHTERS OF CHARITY, NCHIA-ELEME, RIVERS STATE FROM 29TH APRIL-1ST MAY, 2022.

THEME: "THE POOR SUFFERS MORE DUE TO LACK OF COLLABORATION".

PREAMBLE

We, the members of the Vincentian family Nigeria, met at St. Louise Provincial house of the Daughters of Charity, Nchia-Eleme, Rivers State from 29th April-1st May, 2022 and deliberated prayerfully on the aforementioned theme do hereby issue the following communique:

That,

- Collaboration involves hard work, empathy, listening, and more hard work in the growth of the church.
- Collaboration involves the formation of Vincentian Professional Confraternities like lawyers, engineers, teachers, doctors, graphic designers, e.t.c.
- In the spirit of systemic change, the 'hand-on' approach was preferred to the 'hand-out' approach of Vincentian charity.

- We should develop a functional website for data collection and classification survey of members.
- There should be proper communication among the various arms of the family.
- Members need to eschew competition and support joint FAMVIN projects.
- The CMs and the DCS should improve on the spiritual formation and accompaniment of other arms of FAMVIN.
- There should be restructuring of the Vincentian Marian Youth (VMY) to make them more formidable.
- There is need for increased financial commitment of the various arms for effective running of the FAMVIN affairs.
- The different arms should fashion out strategies to groom and mentor young future Vincentians.

- There should be more focus on internal funds generation for project sustainability while welcoming external interventions.
- There should be regional reports of FAMVIN activities of the different zones at AGM.
- There should be improved partnership with governmental bodies to fashion out strategies to contain the growing rate of poverty in Nigeria.

The president Fr Cletus Kpalap and the vice-president Sr Ifeoma Arinze should see to the SSVP crisis in Lagos and ensure it is resolved.
